Kirkcudbright lies 25 miles beyond (west of) Dumfries on the coast, south of the A75. We are a popular destination from Ireland, being only 50 miles from the ferry terminals at Cairnryan. Just 3 hours from Manchester or Leeds and 2 hours from Glasgow or Edinburgh.

### By air

Airports at Edinburgh, Glasgow and Prestwick, all within a 2-hour drive, provide scheduled international flights.
